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





2 FIRST STEPS


After logging onto the platform, you'll see the home screen. From here you are able to access the courses. On the top-right menu, you'll be able to find notifications, messages and your profile settings.





You can change the language of the platform by clicking on your profile in the upper-right corner, then select Language and choose the one you prefer. The language will also change depending on the language of the course you've chosen






